powers, we can better and more practically assess Britain's global approach in relation to the Ukraine war.

The tendency towards pluralism and a move away from European cohesion is the main goal of the UK in its Global Britain approach post-Brexit regarding Ukraine, aiming to integrate this country into the international community and prevent it from falling under Russia's umbrella. In the post-Brexit period, the Global Britain approach has viewed the Ukraine crisis through a pluralistic lens and from outside the European Union, so the UK has acted independently and within the framework of pluralism in engaging with the issue and making decisions regarding it.

Focusing on primary institutions and striving for independent institution-building after Russia's attack on Ukraine in February 2022, and considering the Global Britain approach in UK foreign policy, the country has made significant efforts to bolster primary institutions to maintain an international order based on rules. During this period, the UK has also been working to create new security arrangements to contain Russia and address the challenges in Eastern Europe and the Black Sea as secondary institutions under its leadership.

The pursuit of great power and a special relationship with the U.S. has led to a stronger position within British foreign policy regarding the Ukraine war, allowing London to take a firmer stance in support of Kyiv. Britain's role in the global response to the crisis has been enhanced due to its close ties with the U.S., and in fact, the "special relationship" has strengthened a shared sense of responsibility to address the Ukraine crisis, resulting in increased joint efforts and commitments.

Conclusion

Since Brexit, the UK has responded practically and promptly to Russia's attack on Ukraine in 2022 by adopting a "Global Britain" approach in its foreign policy. In fact, the idea of "Global Britain" has played a significant role in the UK's international engagement and in restoring its status as a great power in the post-Brexit era. Based on this concept, the UK's approach to the Ukraine war has been increasingly proactive and effective. The adoption of the "Global Britain" strategy has been crucial in shaping and activating the UK's foreign policy concerning the war in Ukraine.
